Whistle Blowers Not Welcome in Wisconsin?

Republicans in the passed state budget repealed a law which encouraged whistle blowers with evidence of

Medicaid fraud to come forward. There were no hearings or public input.




Wisconsin, since 2007, did

recover millions in lawsuits initiated by whistle blowers.

We had passed this whistle blower law after the 2005 federal Deficit Reduction Act which gave states an additional 10% incentive to stop and prosecute Medicaid fraud.

Who did not like the Whistle Blower law is the U.S. Chamber of Commerce representing those health care corporations involved in the fraud.



Work Until You Die?

The Republican budget will it allow employees to work the hours they want. But it is really an effort to weaken workers' rights. A provision in the state

budget will allow workers to voluntarily agree to work seven-days a week without a day off. Republicans voted down a Democratic attempt to remove the change from the two-year state budget.

Under the old state law, employers who own factories and retail stores must allow their workers at least 24 consecutive hours of rest in every seven consecutive days. The requirement doesn't apply to janitors,



security guards, bakeries, restaurants, hotels and certain dairy and agricultural plants.

This is widely viewed as a workers' rights law. "Intended to be pro-labor legislation so that employers couldn't force somebody to work seven days a week," UW-Milwaukee Professor Mordecai Lee said.

"Very, very bad policy-wise for Wisconsin working people," Stephanie Bloomingdale with the Wisconsin AFL-CIO said. Bloomingdale says this proposal is an attempt to strong-arm employees into working more hours. "This is coercive. If the boss says to an employee 'we need you to work this seventh day,' most likely the employee is going to say okay," Bloomingdale said.

As Mordecai Lee points out, we don't know who authored this proposal. "Here is an example of a law that didn't come from Governor Walker. And so it slipped into the budget by somebody unnamed," Lee said. Unnamed because it was part of a long list of changes adopted by the Joint Finance Committee last week. The majority party (in this case, Republicans) is allowed to add the changes.

"Whether we are talking about the Republicans or the Democrats, they put in a kind of miscellaneous amendment at the end where everything is grouped together without any individual authorship. It's just a grab-bag of ideas. It's a kind of Christmas tree to the majority party to itself," Lee said.

'It Is None of Your Business, Scott Walker'

As reported on July 30, 2015 by the Associated Press, newly released documents show Scott Walker's office was involved in drafting a state budget amendment that would have overhauled Wisconsin's open records law and kept some government materials secret.

He tried to keep secret legislative drafting documents and notes, personal property and other materials from the open records law, including so called "deliberative process" materials, communications that include opinions, analyses, briefings, recommendations, suggestions and drafts related to bills.

From Retiree Department


Machinists Union Retiree Coordinators received this email from our director with the information sheet on the left side

"The office has been experiencing several telephone calls regarding deceased family members. As you know a provision is provided in our IAM Constitution that gives retirees instruction on updating addresses.

Under Article H - Retired and Exempt Members and Life Members Cards, currently on page 124 of the Constitution. As a retiree wishing to remain in standings must follow this article. (Simply, a Retiree with less than 30 years need to follow this rule to keep his/her address is current.) Exempt/Life Members are not required, but still would be a good idea to let the local know and the department keep records current."

Or you can call 1-800-362-9472. You will need to give your address; then ask who is your state senator and or assembly person; and ask what district you are in.

Once you get the contact information go ahead and give them your opinion but be polite.

Senate Reauthorizes Older Americans Act

The U.S. Senate passed S.192, the Older Americans Act (OAA) Reauthorization Act of 2015, on Thursday. The OAA provides essential services for nearly 12 million seniors such as nutrition programs, job training, caregiver support, transportation and protection from abuse and financial exploitation. The Senate passed the bill the same week that the nation celebrates the 50th Anniversary of the OAA; President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Older Americans Act into law in July 1965.

"The Alliance applauds yesterday's bipartisan action in the U.S. Senate reauthorizing the Older Americans Act," said Ruben Burks, Secretary-Treasurer of the Alliance. "The bill was supported by nearly 100 national organizations representing tens of millions of Americans, including the Alliance, the National Council on Aging, and Meals on Wheels America. Now we need the House of Representatives to do the same."
