Our Government Continues To Export OUR JOBS!

The Republican controlled House of Representatives and the Republican controlled Senate did approve the Oman Free Trade Agreement. This now goes to the Republican President to sign.

This bill accelerates the loss of American jobs and lowers our standard of living. It was opposed by labor, religious, consumer and environmental groups since this agreement also included extensive and binding protections for corporate profits and intellectual property but they include no protections for workers right to organize Unions, no basic environmental standards, or no human rights protections.

The OFTA also permits foreign ownership of port security to foreign corporations. The Republicans say one thing and vote the other way - shame on them.



IAM Organizing – A Difficult Task but Necessary for Our Survival

Notes from the Educator By Patricia Elizondo

In mid June I was called by District 10 to learn that I had been asked by the Machinists Union Midwest Territory to participate in an IAM organizing campaign in Lincoln, Nebraska. Nurses employed at BryanLGH Medical Center, in Lincoln, had contacted the IAM looking for assistance with setting up a Union earlier this year and the house visit campaign was underway.

I was curious as to why I was being asked to get involved with this campaign because my only prior experience with organizing was a blitz I had volunteered for about six years ago. I was told that the IAM wanted women to be a major part of this event because we would be attempting to organize nurses. I was anxious and extremely nervous about the responsibility ahead of me. I've been a Union member for 33 years (10 with the IAM) and understand the importance of growing our Union, but the thought that kept going through my head was that there had to be Machinists with more organizing experience and better suited for this task.

There were fourteen of us at the orientation – seven women and seven men, along with Darrin Nedrow, the Grand Lodge Representative in charge of the Bryan LGH organizing campaign and Mike King, Midwest Territory Communicator. Five of the seven women were either grand lodge or special representatives with the Midwest Territory. The men were all from lodges in Nebraska. I was relieved. Because of my inexperience, I knew I would be paired up with someone who would take the lead and let me sit back and learn. Wrong!! We were told that the women were the team leaders and that we would be paired up with one of our brothers from Nebraska. Much to my surprise, I didn't panic (much!).

I expressed my concerns about my lack of experience and was met with more support than I could imagine. The Midwest representatives were a constant source of encouragement and absolutely wonderful to work with. Brother Nedrow always kept a positive attitude and met with us every morning for reports and to express his confidence in our abilities. My partner was patient and, although I took the lead during the house visits, he was always ready to step in and helped me pick up the slack. By the end of the week, he seldom got a word in!

As I look back at my experience in Lincoln, it was rewarding and I would do it again. Everyday I became more and more confident in my ability to get the IAM message out to the nurses from BryanLGH. It was actually very simple. I truly believe in the labor movement and the importance of growing our membership. After a few visits I found I didn't need to follow a script or rely on my partner to fill in the blanks. I spoke from the heart and it became easy to talk about the benefits of belonging to the Machinists Union.

At Lodge 66, we are looking to add members to our Organizing Committee. Please consider getting involved. The next time District 10 puts out a call for assistance on a blitz, give some serious thought to giving organizing a try. Put your anxieties and fears aside and help us grow the IAM. It's a matter of survival and maintaining the benefits we enjoy today.

Drug Industry Benefiting on Backs of the Poor

The already lucrative pharmaceutical industry has discovered a new way to increase earnings. The automatic transfer of 6.5 million low income people in the Part D program from Medicaid has created much larger than expected profits for drug makers, with some estimates stating the windfall could be up to \$2 billion this year. Because Medicaid, which by law received the lowest available drug prices, no longer buys medicines, drug companies are able to charge insurers higher prices from the drugs offered under Part D plans. The drug industry has raised wholesale prices of brand name drugs an average of 3.6% since Part D went into effect.
