Fair Trade and You

When you hear the term Fair Trade, you might think of coffee. You might also think of chocolate, or bananas, tea, handicrafts. But what does the term mean?

Fair Trade refers to a trading partnership that focuses on equity in international trade. One of its main focuses is allowing poor, subsistence level workers to receive fair compensation for their labor and a fair price for their goods. This is a step toward a just and sustainable economic system.

In the city of Milwaukee, the Milwaukee Fair Trade Coalition (<u>www.milwfairtrade.org</u>) dedicates a weekend in May for more that 30 socially responsible shops to offer discounts, tastings, other specials, and educational events to demonstrate fair trade. Here in the United States we find many examples of Fair Trade Goods. Coffee sold at many local coffee shops, such as Anodyne and Alterra, and groceries, textiles, jewelry and other labor intensive goods can be found without much searching in almost every grocery and department store. Even coffee giant Starbucks is committee to buying 100% of its coffee from "ethnically sourced" suppliers by the year 2015.

One store that specializes in these types of products is Future Green located at 2352 S. Kinnickinnic Avenue, Milwaukee. In addition to Fair Trade Goods they also focus on eco-friendly products from flooring to toiletries.

What does Fair Trade mean to the average American Worker? If a coffee producer in Mexico is paid a living wage for his work he will more likely to continue to produce coffee rather than going into the cities and working in a factory that might take American jobs away from Americans. If a woman in India is paid a decent living for weaving and dyeing her textiles she will less likely to go into the cities to take a job in a call center.

People in developing nations that have Fair Trade work are more likely to have community pride, invest in their own family and community and help their neighbors. And that is a fairness we can all live with.



Employee Free Choice Act *does allow secret ballot elections.*

The 1935 National Labors Relations Act (Wagner Act) had three aspects. One of which "left the decision whether to organize entirely to employees." A corporation had no say.

What activists judges and an unfriendly congress did was to modify the law giving corporations an unilateral rejection in recognizing a Union and force 42 days of intimidation, threats and firing before an election can be held.

The Employee Free Choice Act does allow card check recognition **or a secret ballot election** (if 30% of the workers so petition). This will put the power back to workers not corporations.

Scholarship Program of United Lodge 66

This program is meant to assist two high school seniors that are children of a United Lodge 66 member. Listed below are the criteria for the Scholarship Selection:

- 1. Two (2) \$500 scholarship annually.
- 2. Only seniors in High School that are children of Machinists Union United Lodge 66 Members and those that are seeking post High School Education are eligible.
- 3. An essay must be written and **must be based on how Unions have been important to your family and community** to be considered for the Scholarship. Information should be gathered from your parents or relatives and the struggles they may have faced in their jobs. The essays must be at least 500 words in length. **Please note, "Essays written from Labor History Books, encyclopedias, etc., will NOT BE ACCEPTED."**
- 4. Essays must be sent to: United Lodge 66, 2611 W. Oklahoma Avenue, Milwaukee, WI 53215. Essays will be given to the Scholarship Committee to review.
- 5. After a review of the competency of each essay, a selection process will follow and the winner will be the essay that best meets the requirements stated above.
- 6. One half of the Scholarship will be paid directly to the school in the first semester (fall 2009) in which the individual is enrolled. The second half will be paid during the second semester (spring 2010) and also sent directly to the school. Selections of essay winners will take place at the September Lodge Meeting. The essays must be in at United Lodge 66 office by July 31, 2009 or postmarked July 31, 2009 Absolute, no entries will be accepted past this date.
- 7. Notification of availability of Scholarship will be published in the Badger *Lodge News*, our Website, and posted in all worksites.

The selection committee will be executive board members. We urge all Union parents in United Lodge 66, with High School Seniors in their family, to encourage their children to enter this contest for consideration of a Scholarship. All entries become the property of United Lodge 66 and winning or any entries will or may be published in the *Badger Lodge News*, our Website.



Application for Withdrawal Card

This card will or may save members money but they need to take action and in a timely manner. The card is available if:

- Left the trade because of illness
- Obtained employment outside the trade or industry
- Furthering education
- Obtained a supervisory position above the rank of working foreman
- Because of circumstances over which I have no control, am compelled, as a condition of employment, to join anther labor organization.

Also the current month dues along with the \$1.00 fee must be presented to the Lodge.

Once a member does lapse their membership they are not entitled to take out a withdrawal card.

Members need to do something, contact us, within two months of last paying dues. The Lodge does mail the appropriate information to members and why shop chairs need to communicate to all members what are their alternatives.

Applications for new members

It is the responsibility of each shop chair to make sure new employees fill out the Machinists Union Membership Application. This needs to be done before the Union Security clause date and then: (a) one copy is kept by the new member; (b) one copy goes to your payroll department; (c.) one copy is sent to United Lodge 66.

We do provide all shop chairs with the new member application and self addressed stamped envelopes. Before your worksite runs out of either you need to contact this office and more will be sent.

Member Reimbursement Form for Lost Time

All members must use this form to be reimbursed any lost time from United Lodge 66. The form needs to be complete. The member does need to have a W4 form on file at the Lodge. This only needs to be done once and we keep it forever. The W4 only needs to be updated if you change your dependents.

Your business agent needs to sign this form before there is any payment.

There is also a place, "Applicants Signature." The member needs to sign this. Why? By signing you stipulate that the Lodge is reimbursing you for lost time and not your employer. If a member is caught double dipping they will have to repay the money and they will be forbidden from holding any representative position in the Machinists Union. (*per Grand Lodge*)

Seniors Corner

Coyle Says Not to Overreact to Trustees Reports

The financial health of Social Security and Medicare has worsened because of the severe recession, according to Trustees Reports released a few weeks ago. However, Alliance leaders cautioned the public not to panic. "The impact of the recession on Social Security and Medicare Trust Funds underscores the critical need to support President Obama's plans to reform health care and create a lasting economic recovery. Putting more Americans back to work will send more money into these Trust Funds, and a universal, more efficient health care system will alleviate the severe strain that our health care crisis imposes on both families and employers," said Edward Coyle, Executive Director of the Alliance.

Senate Finance Committee Offers Options

Although only as discussion items to our health care crisis, several options were discussed. Some would allow Americans 55-64 years of age to buy into Medicare; improve Medicare Part D prescription drug benefit; and financing a public health plan. The one option of taxation of health care plans (*your health care plan*) did not specifically say to tax the cost of benefits or the income of the people receiving them.

Fair Trade vs Free Trade

Past administrations have favored free trade agreements at any cost of the American people. Bush never saw a trade agreement he would not sign, all in favor of corporations. President Clinton did wrong with NAFTA and we let him know.

The **2009 TRADE Act** (Trade, Reform, Accountability, Development and Employment) would begin the process of creating a new agenda for trade by accomplishing four major objections:

- 1. Pausing negotiations on all new trade agreements.
- 2. Mandating a new comprehensive review of all past trade agreements to better understand economic and social impact of those trade agreements.
- 3. Setting standards beneficial to workers, communities, and the environment by which any future candidate country for a free trade agreement would be evaluated by.
- 4. Restoring Congress' constitutional responsibility to oversee U.S. trade policy.
