Employee Free Choice Act

Our right to negotiate better working conditions is governed by the National Labor Relations Act of 1935. While this was the strongest pro worker legislation to pass and thereafter had the biggest growth in Union membership and the middle class it did not last long. The problem was *activist judges*, neo-conservative or reactionary judges, who put their own interpretation on the law. The law went from one of right for workers to protecting the employer and to disenfranchise any organizing.

The see-saw could be balanced with the passage of the Employee Free Choice Act, HR 800. This law would allow Union representation if more than 50% of workers sign cards backing a Union. Therefore the employer would not be able to threaten and intimidate workers during an election process. This would negate the harm done by *activist judges*.

This bill will also impose federal mediation and binding outcomes if the Union and company can not agree on the first time contract. Right now a company can drag negotiations out and discourage a first contract.

There would also be stronger penalties for violation of employee rights when workers want to form a Union and during the first contract negotiations.

Election Day Off?


Representative Zepnick (9th Assembly District) is re-introducing legislation to permit all employees to have the day off on election day.

Bush Budget Takes a Bite out of Medicare and Medicaid

Bush's proposal to Congress will take away \$101.5 billion from these programs over five years. He would eliminate the annual inflation adjustment of the income thresholds for higher Medicare Part B premiums. "This would in turn raise costs for middle and lower income seniors who depend on it," said Edward Coyle, Executive Director of the ARA. Bush would also make permanent the cutbacks in payments to hospitals and nursing homes, so they would never received full updates due to inflation. This will shift costs to states.
