Grand Lodge Convention Reports

I was fortunate to be elected as a delegate to the IAMAW 37th Grand Lodge Convention which was held in Orlando, Florida. The opening ceremonies of the convention were quite impressive and included representatives of the Boy Scouts presenting the colors of both the United States and Canada. They marched in, accompanied by bag pipe players.

The theme of the convention was taken from the Inaugural speech of Franklin D. Roosevelt which addressed the "Four Freedoms". The four freedoms are:

> Freedom from fear Freedom of speech Freedom from want Freedom of religion

International IAMAW President, Tom Buffenbarger, opened the convention by saying over the next few days over 1500 IAM convention delegates will make decisions, life and death decisions about what kind of Union the IAMAW would be.

Guest speakers emphasized the "call for action" in the upcoming Presidential election. AFL-CIO Executive Vice President, Arlene Holt-Baker, echoed President Buffenbarger's importance of the election. Senator Hillary Clinton gave a forty minute speech in which she stated "I believe this country is worth fighting for" and that is why she is fighting to elect Senator Barack Obama to be the next President of the United States.

As delegates, it was our responsibility to vote on proposals that we thought would keep the structure of the IAMAW strong and financially secure for the years to come. Our great Union needs to have the ability to work hard for all of our members and to continue attempting to get solid contracts through negotiations.

This is the law of the land, the law in Wisconsin since 1945. All you have to do is make arrangements in advance with your employer. Your employer can not simply say you can vote before or after your normal work hours. The law says hours must be afforded during the work day if that is what the employee requests.

As a matter of fact, an official of the Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce business group regularly reminds business owners of their obligation under the law.

"You could see people going from being labor people to being Democrats to being Republicans. Benefits that came from organized labor and high wages produced a class of people that thought themselves above the labor class," so spoke Milwaukee Mayor Frank Zeidler.

Making A Positive Choice

"If you put your mind to it, there is nothing you cannot accomplish." Any American parent worth his or her salt repeats this to their child. As Americans, we believe passionately in making our own destiny. We educate ourselves, create better lives for our children, work together in our unions and our workplaces and our communities to improve the life we and our neighbors and our friends lead.

When my mother was born, women did not have the right to vote. Women marched and petitioned and were ridiculed and beaten and they got up and stood for what was right and just, and on August 26, 1920, the Constitution was amended to give us this hard-won vote.

Forty-three years later, almost to the day, a Community Organizer stood on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. and spoke to America. He asked us to put aside our differences and look at one another as Americans. He asked us to judge one another, not by the color of our skins, but by the content of our character.

Forty-five years after that speech, we Americans are faced with a choice. A man, whose mother surely told him "If you put your mind to it, there is nothing you cannot accomplish," stands poised to be the first man of African American descent to be elected President. He represents each of us whose parents told us we can accomplish anything. But his color is not important. For he is an American, just as John McCain is an American.

Your choice, when you enter your voting place, should not be based on a candidate's color, because you are an American, and we Americans are better than that. I ask you to look beyond Senator Obama's color and Senator McCain's age, and decide for yourself who will best serve this great nation and lead her through financial and environmental crises. Which one proposes a plan to renegotiate NAFTA and bring jobs back to America, and which one proposes to make you pay taxes the money your employer contributes to your healthcare? Which of them studied Constitutional Law and was the President of the Harvard Law Review, and which of them graduated fifth from the bottom in his class at the Annapolis Naval Academy? Which one chose the Chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee as his running mate, and which one chose a former member of the Alaska Independence Party, a group which advocates secession from the Union?

I would not presume to tell you how to vote, for you are Americans, and you are Union Members, and you know which choice will bring change and improvement to our communities, our workplaces, and our lives.

Seniors Corner

Benefits for Social Security Recipients, Federal Retirees to Increase by 5.8%

Following a year of rising food and energy prices, benefits for Social Security recipients and federal government retirees will see a 5.8% increase, the largest cost-of-living adjustment since 1982, in 2009. Although large compared to last year's 2.3% increase, many experts believe the rising prices will exceed the increase in benefits. Nonetheless, if the McCain-supported Social Security privatization initiative of 2005 had not successfully been defeated, seniors would have seen an enormous drop in benefits, not a record increase. Alliance Secretary-Treasurer Ruben Burks remarked, "As of this week, the Dow is down 35.33% for the year. If John McCain and George W. Bush had had their way, seniors would have seen a massive reduction in their benefits from Social Security – a far cry from the nearly 6% increase we will enjoy instead."
