# No Respect

# **Labor Department Gets Its Groove Back**

After decades of non-enforcement, U.S. Department of Labor Secretary Hilda Solis has begun hiring new investigators to begin cracking down on employers who use illegal labor tactics.

The Wall Street Journal reports Secretary Solis will be adding 670 investigators to the rolls, including 150 in the Wage and Hour Division, 75 in the Employee Benefits Security Administration and 100 more to ensure contractor compliance on stimulus projects.

In addition, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has formed a new task force to combat severe violators of workplace safety regulations.

The latest announcement comes just months after President Obama reversed and delayed a series of pro-business, anti-worker policies put in place by the Bush administration. One such rule, which inundated labor Unions with tedious and unnecessary financial disclosures, is currently under review.

#### **Wisconsin State Council of Machinists Conference**

September 10 to 12, 2009

The fall conference for Machinists Union Locals met to discuss and be educated on issues and the financial officers were updated on how they should be performing on applying dues and making sure all reports are done on time.

Midwest Territory Grand Lodge Representative Steve Nickel gave a detailed and not always good report on the organizing efforts within our Union.

Marianne Robbins talked about Chapter 7 and Chapter 11 bankruptcy and members need to check out any rumors about their employer. If your employer does go bankrupt then members or the Union need to file 'proofs of claims' to make sure the employer is held accountable.

Our Grand Lodge Auditor talked about what a difference a change in administration has done for the Department of Labor. Under the reactionary Bush Regime the DOL did nothing but attack and try to put Unions out of business. Now the funding has reverting back where the DOL is transferring agents to go after wage and hour issues, or looking into how employers do their business. If there are issues of dues not coming into locals in a timely manner he will get involved in such issues.

Representative Ron Kind, 3rd District in western Wisconsin, spoke to the delegates. While he represents a mostly rural and conservative district he stated there

must be health care reform. The costs of our present health care system is out of control and will only get worse. If left alone more Wisconsinites will be without any health care. Any health care reform must not deny coverage to any citizen based on pre-existing conditions.

Also, 'we need to look for sustainable growth and not go from bubble to bubble as we are now,' he stated. Jobs in new technology are needed.

He spoke of the despicable actions of Mercury Marine pitting two groups of workers, two cities and two states against each other. This is why he supports the Employee Free Choice Act to create a more balanced playing field. The workers took it on the chin for poor management.



### Safety and Health Class

In August I attended the William W. Winpisinger Education and Technology Center with some 70 other members at the Health and Safety Class. On the first day we learned about looking at the workplace inspections and setting up a joint labor and management safety and health committee. The rest of the week we will continue to learn more about these issues as well as employee soft tissue injury and awareness..

The material covered has been developed by the Machinists Union Corporation for Re-Employment and Safety Training (CREST), in cooperation with the School for Workers-University of Wisconsin Extension, Workers Health and Safety Centre, Hamilton, Ontario; and the Workplace Health Fund, labors own Research and Educational Development Institute, sponsored by the Industrial Union Department of the AFL-CIO; ICWUC Center for Workers Health and Safety; Great Lakes Regional OTI Education Center, Eastern Michigan University OSHA Training Institute, University of Cincinnati; University of Minnesota and the OSHA office of training and education.

As you can see this is the best of the best teaching our members how to insure that our brothers and sisters work safely across the country. While this training is very helpful our members are still subjected to workplace injuries and fatalities. In 2009 at the WWW Center there were seven members who had a memorial brick dedicated at the Member Worker Memorial Lighthouse on the grounds.

On Tuesday we did continue with the training modules on Employee Soft Tissue Injury and Illness Awareness, Body and Workplace Occupational Stress, and Permit Required Confined Space.

On Wednesday our modules included: Accident/Incident and Near Miss Investigation, Toxicology Awareness with the Workplace, and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). In the PPE module we learned the different types of protective equipment that is needed to keep ourselves safe. We also learned from the OSHA the specific limitations of the said PPE. We need to take care of each other. If you notice someone that may not want to wear their PPE it would be wrong to allow them to continue without encouraging them to wear the proper equipment. Their family

will also appreciate that their loved ones come home or not develop a workplace illness.

On Thursday our learning module was on Job Safety Analysis and working on our class presentation on Looking at Workplace Area Inspections. There was also a presentation by Machinists Union Grand Lodge General Vice President Richard Michalski.

On Friday we gave our presentation and received our completion certificates.

The Organizing Lead sheet is available from your Union office or can be downloaded from the home page at <a href="www.unitedlodge66.org">www.unitedlodge66.org</a>. They are simple to fill in. Just talk to your friends and find out if they want to have a voice at work and stop being an Employee at Will.

## Reimbursement of Lost Time for Committee Person

While you will be reimbursed for lost time it may not be as fast as you would like if proper procedure is not followed. Foremost, reimbursement will only be done as stated in the letter from District 10 to Financial Officers dated January 23, 2009.

This must happen or be on file at the Lodge office:

- W4 must be completed by you and on file at the LL66 office. This needs be done only once.
- Properly complete the Lodge 66 Reimbursement Form.
- Lost time must be approved by your business agent at District 10.

Since October 2006 all lost time is paid by ADP payroll. Payroll is done only twice a month. If you miss one payroll date then it will have to wait until the next. Lost time reimbursement forms must be into the LL66 office before the Monday of a payroll date.

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#### **Initiation Fee**

Per the Lodge 66 Bylaws: "The Initiation fee will be the applicable monthly dues for the respective shop of employment for all members."

This was changed in 2001 and remember this is a fee not a due.

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# Honorary Withdrawal Card

#### There is a \$1.00 Fee - It Is Not Free

There has always been a fee for the withdrawal card. All too often a member sends in the application for the card and expects one at no cost.

Withdrawal cards are allowed if:

- Left the trade because of illness
- Obtained employment outside the trade or industry.
- Furthering education.
- Obtained a supervisory position above the rank of working foreman.
- Because of circumstances over which I have no control, am compelled, as a condition of employment, to join another labor organization.

In order to get the withdrawal card a member must obtain such within two months of paying dues.

#### President Obama Health Care Speech Clears the Air of Myths and Falsehoods

In a rare speech to a joint session of Congress President Obama madean impassioned plea to provide health insurance for those currently without it. The President also disputed myths and lies that his proposal would create "death panels," finance abortions or provide government funded care to illegal immigrants. According to the publication The Hill, President Obama "excoriated" critics of his efforts, warning that while his "door is always open" to members of either party who want to offer constructive suggestions, he "will not waste time with those who have made the calculation that it's better politics to kill this plan than to approve it." The President said that he would not accept the status quo as a solution. "I will not back down on the basic principle that if an American can't find affordable coverage, we will provide you with a choice," the President declared.


