

## IAM Experis Video Game Workers Hold Solidarity Day of Action as First Contract Negotiations Drag On

On June 4, 2024 workers at the IAM Experis Testers Cooperative held a Solidarity Day of Action in front of their parent company, Manpower Group, in downtown Milwaukee. The video game testers were joined by fellow IAM Brothers and Sisters from District 10, the Midwest Territory and community members in an

effort to pressure Manpower to reach a fair first contract in their ongoing negotiations.

In November 2023, Experis workers voted 35-4 to unionize with the IAM to address multiple workplace issues. Their elected bargaining committee then entered into negotiations in February 2024. Recently, however, they have met headwinds in bargaining as management has made it clear that they view each of their employees as temporary and have laid off eight members of the bargaining unit since the beginning of the year.

The workers, who were not told about their "temporary" status when they were hired, are responsible for quality assurance and troubleshooting of newly developed video games. The video game industry is notorious for chronic, widespread workplace problems like low wages, employee burnout, and frequent layoffs. Experis workers are in a historic struggle to change this.

## Past Sacrifices, Future Victories: National Labor Relations Act of 1935

Last month we covered the Taft Hartley Act which chronologically came after The National Labor Relations Act, also known as the Wagner Act. We jumped out of line to keep up with covering important labor events in the month of this publication. The National Labor Relations Act was drafted by Robert Wagner, a Senator from New York and ultimately passed by Congress. It was then signed into law on July 5th, 1935 by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt.

By 1935 The United States was already 6 years into the Great Depression. There was a need for work and as such employers were taking advantage of workers

who needed to provide for their families. There was a great need for equality in bargaining power between employers and employee unions. Before the Act was passed employers were permitted to form employee unions, or yellow unions that were heavily influenced by the company leading to decisions being made that



would not favor workers.

Robert Wagner set out to change the landscape in employer and union relations and wrote the bill as we know it today. It outlawed employer unions and gave us most of the freedoms and procedures that we enjoy in our work places today. They include our right to organize, our right to collectively bargain and our right to strike. It also established the National Labor Relations Board which hears cases on labor violations.

The National Labor Relations Act was well received by labor unions and Democrat politicians. It was opposed by Corporations and Republicans. They felt like this new "socialist" law would lead to lesser freedoms for everyone but especially the corporations that employed American workers. They did not want to cede any of their power to workers and wanted to have the ability to continue treating workers poorly without any repercussions.

The Act was challenged in 1937 when the Supreme Court heard "National Labor Relations Board v Jones & Laughlin Steel Corporation." We won't go into detail on this case here but the Act was chal-

lenged on grounds that it was unconstitutional. The Supreme Court ultimately ruled in favor of workers and upheld the National Labor Relations Act as constitutional. There have been other challenges and laws passed to reduce the protections workers receive under the Act. Taft-Hartley is the largest piece of legislation to pass.

In closing The National Labor Relations Act of 1935 gives us the ability to organize, collective bargain and to strike when employers fall short at the negotiating table and so much more. It is perhaps the single most important piece of American legislation for trade unionists.

Experis workers are fighting for good jobs that don't just disappear at the end of a developer's contract and believe that Manpower has a responsibility to provide stable jobs that pay a living wage and help to sustain a vibrant Milwaukee community. In February 2024, the IAM filed Unfair Labor Practice charges with the National Labor Relations Board alleging that Experis held illegal mandatory captive audience meetings during the workers' organizing drive and engaged in illegal retaliation by freezing all hiring, promotions, and pay increases during and after the union election. The investigation is pending.

### **Seniors Corner: Help With Drug Costs**

**What's Extra Help?** "Extra Help" is a Medicare program to help people with limited income and resources pay

Medicare drug coverage (Part D) premiums, deductibles, coinsurance, and other costs. What's a premium, deductible, coinsurance, or copayment? You also won't have to pay a Part D late enrollment penalty while you get Extra Help. What's the Part D penalty? Some people qualify for Extra Help automatically, and other people have to apply.

Who gets Extra Help automatically? You'll get Extra Help automatically if you get:

- Full Medicaid coverage
- Help from your state paying your Part B premiums (from a
- Medicare Savings Program)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits from Social Security

You'll get a letter about your Extra Help. It tells you things like how much you'll pay, and your new Medicare drug plan, if you don't have one already.

If you don't automatically get Extra Help, you can apply for it: <u>https://secure.ssa.gov/i1020/start</u>

You can also contact your local State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) to get free help applying.

Who should apply for Extra Help? In most cases, to qualify for Extra Help, you must have income and resources below a certain limit. These limits may go up each year.
